As you read 1 Peter 2:9-10, discuss how we can live out being a redemptive community.

- We are a chosen race. (1 Peter 2:9)
 - o According to this scripture, why did God choose us?
 - o Why is it important to understand that God wants to flip our "Me thinking" to "We thinking"?
 - o What's the significance of this scripture using "you" (plural) instead of "you" (singular)?
 - o How does this fit in with our one of our five characteristics: "Worship"?
 - We are God's people. (1 Peter 2:10)
 - o What does it mean to be family?
 - o What is the unique beauty of God's family?

o How does us living as God's unique (multi-ethnic, multi-generational) family give hope to our culture? o What's the difference between being "color blind" and "color blessed"?

L.I.F.E. Discuss how each of these words allow us to live as a redemptive community.

- Love (John 13:34-35, Galatians 5:22-23)
 - o How does recognizing the Fruit of the Spirit as one word "Love" change the way we allow God to express it in and through us? (Upward, Inward, Outward)
- Instruction (Acts 2:42-47)

o Translate how this scripture can be lived out today in our culture.

• Fellowship (Hebrews 10:24-25)

o How does the biblical translation of fellowship change the way you live in fellowship with others?

• Expression (Matthew 28:18-20)

o How do you live out being an "expression" of God's redemptive community in a practical way—at home, at school, at work, in your sphere of influence?
